Retrospective planning permission has been applied for. ● Double yellow lines request on St Andrews Road, ongoing ● Damage to the wall in the garage area - Cllr Hayes advised that the resident had been written to and that the matter is ongoing. ● Steadings - There are no updates on changes to speed reduction, bus stop provision or footpath at the new development on St Andrews Road. The Head of Service will inspect. ● Kithrig - the matter has been raised by Cllr Hayes and is ongoing. 	AH

He kindly offered and has repaired the fence, which had to be removed to allow access for the cherry picker. 	
<p>6. AOCB</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Work carried out by Scottish Water near the Curling Club has left the pavement in a poor and dangerous state. Cllr Hayes will report this and follow up. ● Colinsburgh Library - Petra Surplus (Planning) emailed Co-Lead Planning (AB) and CCT Chair (BW) regarding potential accessibility requirements for the Colinsburgh Community Library. She has agreed to a site visit to discuss these details. ● Andrew McMaster will attend to advise on heritage-related implications. Additionally, barriers and grabrails will be included in the conversation in 	AH

<p>accordance with the accessibility requirements.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Grizelda Cowan – Elie and Earsferry CC has emailed Co-Lead Planning (AB) about the narrow bridge over the Cockermill Burn on A917 near the Elie Caravan Park. She has requested two-way priority signs as the road narrows at this point and has been the site of several near misses. She has asked if we would support their campaign.● The road from Kilconquhar on the B941 on the right makes access difficult as visibility at this point is poor. Lifting the signs on the lamp-posts would help improve visibility.● We have new volunteers joining the Community Council: Jan & Roy Rodger, Bobby Barbour. We agreed that we would co-opt them and ratify at the AGM. They were warmly welcomed to the committee. As the AGM will be held at our next meeting, we welcome any residents from Kilconquhar and Colinsburgh to join.
